I have all of these **rights** and many more that are guaranteed by my Constitution.



# My Rights



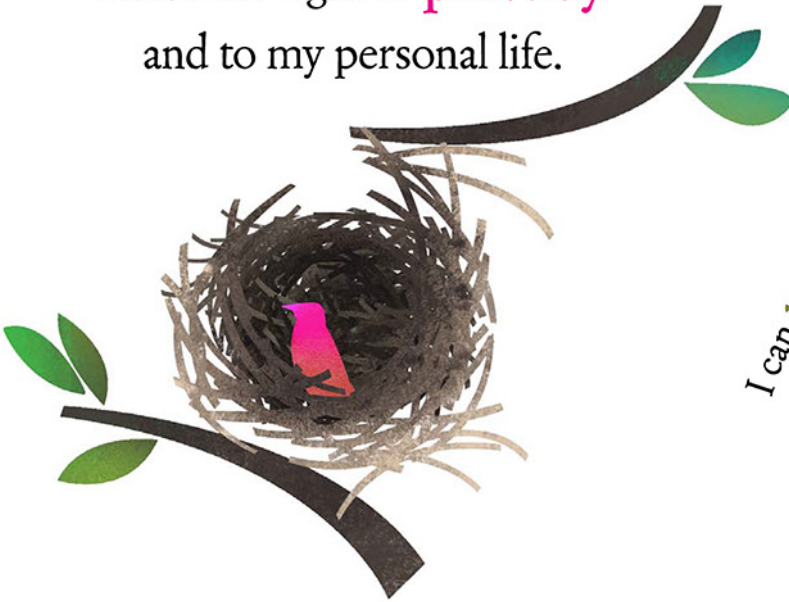
My **dignity** is inviolable.



We are **all equal** before the law, which is why I have the right not to be treated differently because of my religion, my social condition, my sex or my way of thinking.

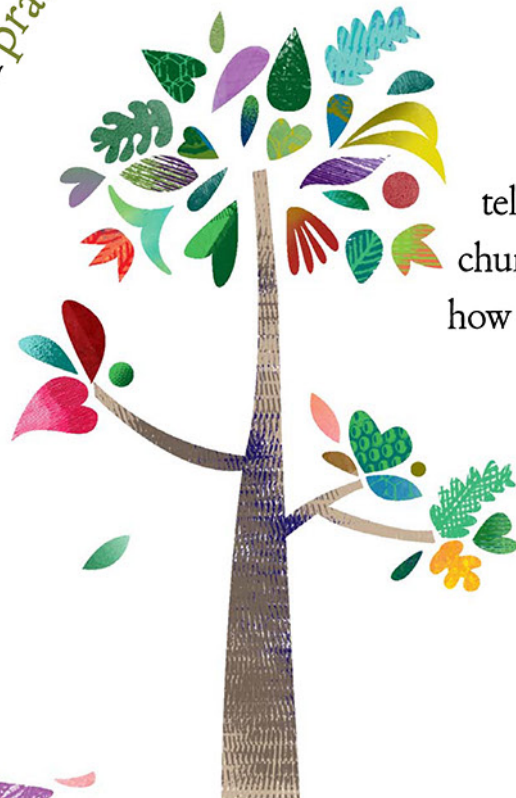


I have the right to **privacy** and to my personal life.
